Subject: EUDR delay – Our continued Commitment

Dear Valued Customer,

Thank you for your proactive engagement regarding EUDR compliance. Today, the EU Parliament adopted the EUDR agreement in trilogue to amendments that both delay and simplify the EUDR. Next, the agreement will be ratified by the EU Council and published in the EU Official Journal (OJEU).

The simplification supports the data collection methodology Danzer already uses for most of our supply chain (80+%), who are micro and small operators in low-risk countries. Danzer will assist these suppliers with the next steps.

Many of our customers tell us that they will still require the data for their own chain-of-custody purposes regardless of the EUDR outcome. **Danzer remains committed to staying at the forefront of compliance and traceability. Our systems, processes, and documentation are already well established and will continue to ensure that our customers receive the information they need – in whichever form the final regulation requires.**

We appreciate the opportunity to support you. Our aim is to give you all essential information in a consistent, reliable format that you can easily integrate into your own systems – while ensuring that the final data entry remains in your control, as neither you nor we can rely on Danzer entering data into many different customer-specific platforms.

To support your compliance before the EUDR eventually enters into force, you will receive:

1. **EU TRACES reference number and token*** from the live platform (if available) for Danzer products, or
2. **GeoJSON files** for the polygons associated with your shipment, and
3. **An explanation of Danzer's Due Diligence** for integration into your own due diligence**, and
4. **Danzer Sales Terms and Conditions** with Appendix 1, the Danzer Geodata Service Agreement.

For products from low-risk regions such as the EU, the United States, and Canada, this is fully sufficient to meet your EUDR obligations, as spelled-out in the unified text of the regulation taken together with its guidance documents.

Because customers use a wide range of internal systems, it is essential that you retain control over your own TRACES entries. This ensures accuracy, avoids compatibility issues, and keeps the final responsibility where it belongs. Danzer therefore provides standardized, validated data – but does not upload information into customer-specific software. You can use the data we supply either to obtain your own reference number and token in TRACES or to reference our DDS number directly.
